

TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES (NO COST TO MEMBERSHIP)



What?

The Coldwater Indian Band are applying for capacity training funds for opportunities for Coldwater Band Membership to work directly on the West Alternative Re-Route proposed by Transmountain.

The training options include these 4 courses:

- <u>Cultural Heritage Monitor Training</u> (3 days)
- Archaeological & CMT Inventory Training (5 days)
- Environmental Monitoring Training (3 days)
- Water Quality Training (2 days)

We would bring the instructor into Merritt so people can take the training locally. The training will be dependant on Covid protocols and guidance.

We need at least 8 people to run a training session and will need to have enough people to run shifts or multiple crews on site at a time during construction. Courses will only be held if there is enough membership registering.

When?

Training would be held in October 2021. This is a call for interest. Once we have enough interest we will schedule the training dates and contact by email or phone.

<u>Please let me know by September 24, 2021</u> in order to set up training dates and venues. The intent is to train community membership so we have trained representatives on site during construction of the West Alternative pipeline.

WHAT?

The TransMountain (TM) Project has been approved and permitted by Canada. Coldwater's court challenge has not stopped the project but has meant that the new pipeline must go around the Coldwater Valley (instead of through) it to protect the aquifer. This route around Coldwater IR #1 is called the "West Alternative." Construction is planned to start in November 2021 for this new oil pipeline.

WHO?

Coldwater Councillors and our consultants, PGL Environmental, are leading this work as part of the West Alternative Committee:

- Councillors Michael Smithers, Corrina Manuel and Leah Collins.
- Bridget Dunne and Leslie Beckmann from PGL, hired by Coldwater.
- Dorothy Spahan hired through PGL, by Coldwater, on a contract basis.

WHY?

The purpose of these meetings is to identify specific locations and values that require protection or management along the West Alternative pipeline and define what those protections should be. Coldwater Indian Band are inviting you to share what needs protection along the proposed Trans Mountain's West Alternative pipeline.






WEST ALTERNATIVE COMMITTEE Notice for Community Input 21-22 SEPTEMBER 2021



Coldwater Indian Band need community input on concerns/questions about TransMountain's West Alternative:

The TransMountain (TM) Project has been approved and permitted by Canada. Coldwater's court challenge has not stopped the project but has meant that the new pipeline must go around Coldwater Valley instead of through it to protect the aquifer (see map). This route around Coldwater IR #1 is called the "West Alternative."



COMMUNITY INPUT

TM plans to begin construction of the West Alternative in November 2021. To make sure we have all the information we need to protect what we value along the pipeline route, the West Alternative Committee are holding online meetings in September (in person meetings will no longer be possible due to covid).
